

Baton Rouge, LA – September 29, 2022. The 19th Judicial District Court is pleased to announce an award of \$700,000 from the U.S. Department of Justice, Bureau of Justice Assistance through the FY2022 Veterans Treatment Court Discretionary Grant Program. Funds from this four year grant will be used to establish a Veterans Treatment Court in East Baton Rouge Parish.

Veterans Treatment Courts are designed to provide opportunities for justice-involved veterans to receive treatment for substance abuse and/or mental health diagnoses, which are often a result of their service to this country. In coordination with the Southeast Louisiana Veterans Health Care System and several local service providers, veterans participating in the Court will receive support and resources to address any identified need or barrier to success, such as housing, employment, education, social, family, and medical assistance.

Once established, The Honorable Ronald R. Johnson will preside over the Veterans Treatment Court. The Court will complement two other successful 19th JDC specialty courts: The David O'Quinn Pre-Trial Diversion & Recovery Program and Adult Drug Court.

The federally funded project will be evaluated by local criminologist Dr. Steven Maberry from Envisage Research and Analytics, a nationally recognized research firm. The results of the evaluation will be showcased throughout the initiative.
